

# Leaping Sheep



What do you get if you cross a sheep with a piece of cardboard? A leaping sheep! A comfort for the insomniac, stand this whimsical model on your bedside table and count sheep jumping until the early hours.

Print out the pieces onto thin cardboard and make your very own woolly jumper.

## **Instructions**

You will need a craft knife or other sharp knife, a pair of scissors, some glue and a glue spreader.

The best type of glue to use is PVA, white school glue.

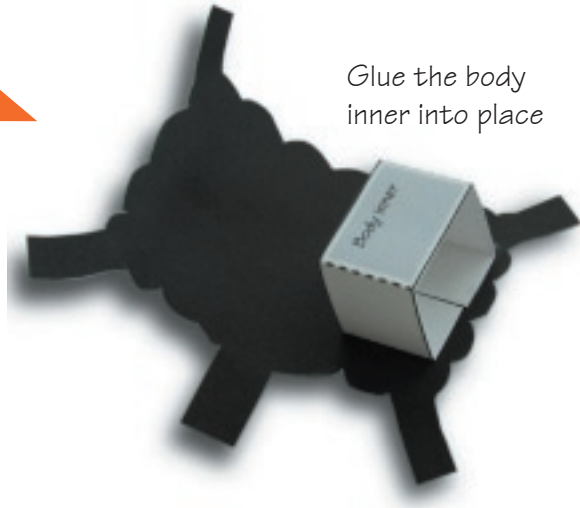
Before cutting anything out, score along all the dotted lines and cut out any holes with a craft knife. Both these jobs are easier to do on full sheets of card.

Dashed lines are hill folds, dotted lines are valley folds. Cut along the solid lines. Grey areas show where to glue.

## Instructions for Construction



Glue together  
the head



Glue the body  
inner into place



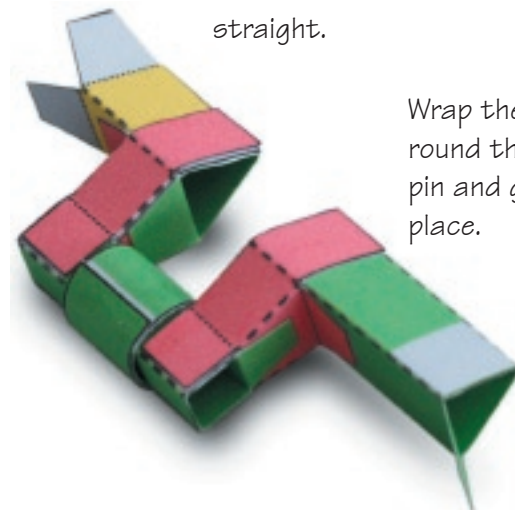
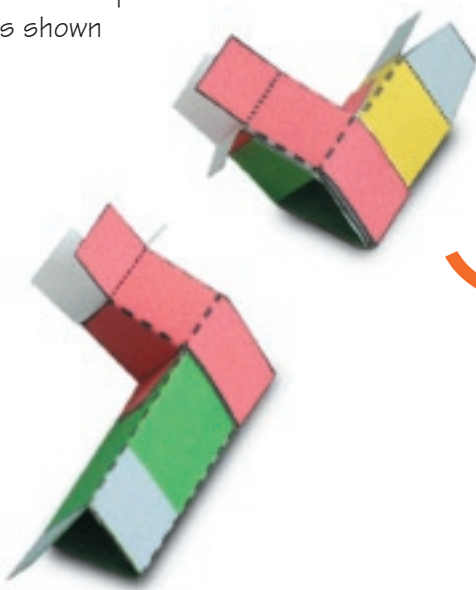
Fold the body round  
and glue it into place...



...then glue the  
head into place.



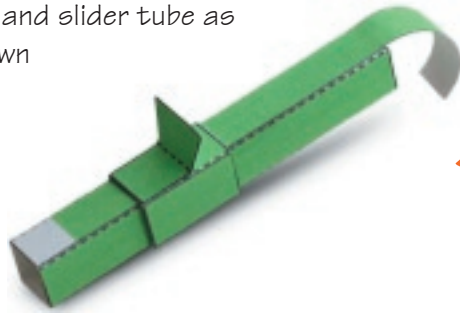
Assemble the  
two crank parts  
as shown



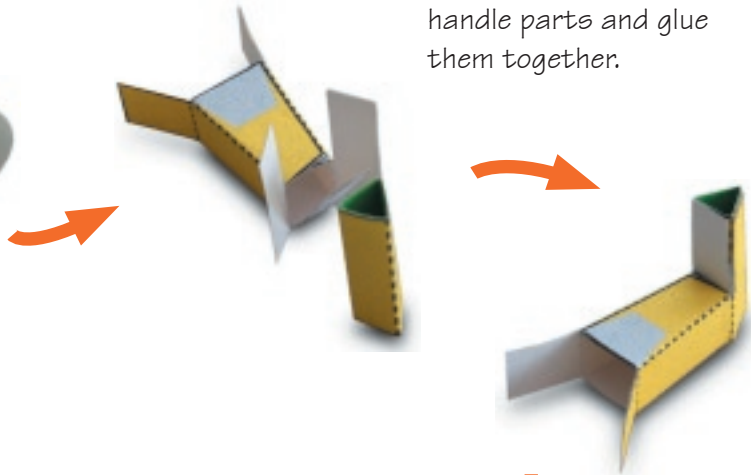
Carefully glue the  
crank pin into place  
making sure that  
the crank remains  
straight.

Wrap the slip ring  
round the crank  
pin and glue it into  
place.

Assemble the push rod and slider tube as shown



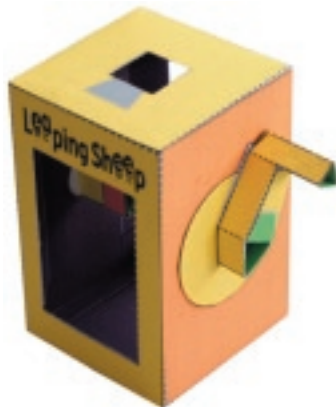
Assemble the two handle parts and glue them together.



Thread the yellow end of the crank shaft through the hole with the yellow ring and glue the washer into place.



Assemble the box around the crank gluing the top and bottom into place.



Thread the slider tube and slip ring through the top of the box and glue the flap on the slider tube down.



Once the glue is dry your sheep is ready to leap!
